Warm Greetings.

The Mindanao Association of State Tertiary Schools' Library Network (MASTSLiNet) existed since October 25, 2014, will be holding its 5th Annual General Assembly Meeting, Planning and Seminar-Workshop with a theme: "The Filipino Librarian and Continuing Professional Development (CPD): Setting the National Agenda Amidst Challenges and Opportunities" come on May 22-24, 2018 at Jose Rizal Memorial State University, Dapitan City.

Mindanao, Davao City, thereby creating the acronym MASTSLiNet:

WHEREAS after its Founding Congress, the MASTS Leadership has approved the formation of the Mindanao Association of State Tertiary Schools Library Network (MASTSLiNet) as a network of Libraries coming from MASTS colleges and universities, together with the University of the Philippines Mindanao as the convening and consulting Library;

WHEREAS the primary objective of MASTSLiNet is spelled out in the acronym One VAM (One Vision, One Access, One Mindanao);

WHEREAS in the furtherance of such an objective MASTSLiNet will promote the establishment, development, enhancement, and effective utilization of academic libraries as they support the instruction, research, extension, and production agenda of MASTS Colleges and Universities;

WHEREAS the 21st Information Century is characterized by information and knowledge creation, development, management, packaging, dissemination, sharing, linkages, and such other forms and types of library collaboration and networking:

WE, THE HEADS OF ACADEMIC LIBRARIES, REPRESENTING THE MINDANAO STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, COMMIT TO:

Go beyond the objectives set by our respective college and university charters by forming a network that will complement areas of support and collaboration in library services relevant to our mandates through a Sustainable Academic Library Action Plan (SALAP) The commitment and the Action Plan will be ratified through our respective procedures;

Prepare a baseline inventory as a basis for the Sustainable Academic Library Action Plan;

Submit the SALAP to the MASTS Leadership within the year following each of us formally signing up to the MASTSLiNet

Covenant of Libraries;

Adapt relevant and necessary academic library structures, including allocation of sufficient human resources, in order to undertake the necessary actions;

Mobilize all stakeholders in our geographical areas to take part in developing the SALAP, outlining the policies and measures needed to implement and achieve the objectives of the Plan. An Action Plan will be produced by each library and shall be submitted to the Presidents of MASTS Colleges and Universities within the year following signing up;

Submit an implementation report during the MASTS General Assembly and at other times whenever and wherever required;

Share our experience and know-how with other library networks, associations, and consortia;

Organize Library Days or State College and University Library Covenant Days, in co-operation with the Offices of Presidents of Mindanao State Colleges and Universities and with other stakeholders, allowing students, faculty, staff, private groups and associations, alumni, and others citizens to benefit directly from the opportunities and advantages offered by networked academic libraries, and to regularly inform the local media and stakeholders on developments concerning the action plan;

Attend and contribute to the annual MASTS Assembly for Sustainable Academic Libraries;

Spread the message of the Covenant in the appropriate fora;

Accept termination of our membership of the Covenant, subject to prior notice in writing by the Secretariat, in case of either:

 - 3.) failing to submit a report in two successive periods.

1. The Role of State College and University Administrations

College and University Administrations are vital in the establishment, development, management, and enhancement of academic libraries. Extending financial support to the activities defined in the SALAP, as well as provides incentive mechanisms to further enhance library personnel duties and responsibilities will ensure sustainability of academic libraries during their terms of office in the short-term, and to eradicate illiteracy in the long-term.

2. The Role of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED)

CHED has the direct link to the national administration. It is highly recommended that CHED makes use of this connectivity to ensure inclusion in the budgets of State Colleges and Universities toward illiteracy eradication by publicly recognizing the role of academic libraries. Such budgetary enclosure will go towards the development of academic libraries information and communications technology infrastructure.

3. The Role of the University of the Philippines (UP)

As the national university of the Philippines, UP has a leading role in the development of state colleges and universities in the Philippines. With campuses spread throughout the country, UP can provide assistance to state academic libraries in terms of sharing its Integrated Library System (ILS), training of librarians and library personnel, information and communications technology infrastructure, knowledge and online databases, and other library services.

4. The Role of the Philippine Association of State Colleges and Universities (PASUC)

As the national association of the state colleges and universities in the Philippines, PASUC has a leading role in the development of state colleges and universities in the Philippines. It is highly solicited that the PASUC provide approval and the necessary support to the initiatives and program of the MASTLINET through the MASTS leadership.

Benchmarks of Excellence (BoE)

'Benchmarks of Excellence' are defined as those initiatives and programs which represent a worldwide model of successful implementation of networked libraries in both urban and rural settings. Representatives of the Benchmarks of Excellence through the Covenant should be willing to share their experience and to help academic libraries implement similar approaches when applicable and convenient, and commit to facilitate know-how transfer through the distribution of information, including guidelines, participation in events of the Covenant signatories and, in general, day-to-day co-operation with the Covenant.

3. Supporting structures

The MASTSLINET Covenant of Academic Libraries is open to all state college and universities libraries of all sizes in Mindanao. Those libraries which due to their size do not have the resources to prepare an inventory, or work on and draft an action plan should be supported by administrations with such capacities. Each supporting structure will be explicitly recognized by the MASTS Leadership as a key actor in the Covenant. The degree of involvement in the Covenant, as well as the specific conditions of such involvement, including decision making powers, will be detailed in a specific written agreement.



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:	
This Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) made and entered into this 2020 between the	

DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY- CARAGA, with office address at CSU, CAMPUS, AMPAYON, BUTUAN CITY represented in this Agreement by its Regional Director, DOMINGA D. MALLONGA, CESO III, herein referred to as the "FIRST PARTY":

SURIGAO STATE COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY - SURIGAO CITY CAMPUS, with office address at Narciso Street, Brgy. Taft, Surigao City represented herein by its College President, Dr. GREGORIO Z. GAMBOA, JR., hereinafter referred to as the "SECOND PARTY";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY, promotes and implements ICT related projects for the advancement of DOST-CARAGA and recognizes the benefits of establishing STARBOOKS in the Region;

WHEREAS, the SECOND PARTY, is mandated to enhance education by providing holistic and quality co-curricular program, projects and activities that will prepare the Filipino children and youth towards the new millennium and to deliver quality, effective, and efficient delivery of educational services.

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement, considering their respective mandates, resources and . expertise, networks and programs and, desirous of accomplishing a better coordinated, shared, more impact-producing project have agreed to work together to accomplish this objective to commence on February 17, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, and in pursuance of their desire to cooperate in a defined area and in recognition of shared interest in strengthening cooperation on science and technology information and activities on the basis of mutual benefits, the FIRST and SECOND PARTY have reached the following agreement:

GENERAL AGREEMENT

1.1 Subject to their respective rights and obligations as set out in this Agreement, the Parties shall cooperate and endeavor to achieve the following:

OBLIGATIONS OF THE FIRST PARTY

- 2.1 The First Party shall, for its exclusive account, timely, properly and adequately perform the following:
 - (a) Responsible for the installation of content updates from the DOST-STII.

(b) Responsible for the mandatory training of STARBOOKS Technology administrator of the SECOND PARTY for the operation of the such;

OBLIGATIONS OF THE SECOND PARTY

- 3.1 The Second Party shall, for its exclusive account, timely, properly and adequately perform the following:
 - (a) Provide a computer for the STARBOOKS Technology;
 - (b) Provide the Computer with an estimated amount of ______, access terminal and other computer devices needed;
 - (c) Provide two (2) point persons (preferably librarian and IT staff) to manage the operations and sustainability of the STARBOOKS project;
 - (d) Provide supplies and materials needed for the operations of the STARBOOKS Technology;
 - (e) Ensure that all proper safety and security measures are followed during the preparations for and actual implementation, if applicable
 - (f) Submit monthly accomplishment/progress report (log usage statistics/problems met/comments and suggestions to improve the system) every 10th day of the following month to DOST-STII. The SECOND PARTY will cease to receive an updated digitized content and upgraded version should it fail to submit the monthly reports for three (3) consecutive months to the DOST-STII:

MISCELLANEOUS CONDITIONS

- 4.1 Safety Measures. The FIRST PARTY shall ensure that all proper safety and security measures are followed during the preparations for and actual implementation of this undertaking.
- 4.2 Intellectual Property. The Parties hereto agree not to violate each other's intellectual property rights consisting of, but not limited to their respective trademarks, copyrights, patents and design, and utility model rights. The parties also recognize the validity and enforceability of these rights and shall not dispute nor challenge the same at any time.
- 4.3 Relationship of the Parties. There is no employer-employee relationship between the FIRST and SECOND PARTY and the latter's officers, employees, agents or representatives who may be assigned to perform the services under this Agreement. It is agreed that FIRST PARTY shall be solely responsible for the respective compensation of said officers, employees, agents or representatives who may be assigned to perform the services under this Agreement. As such, the FIRST PARTY shall hold the SECOND PARTY free from any liability, cause/s of action, claim/s FIRST PARTY's officers, employees, agents or representatives in connection with the services they are assigned to perform under this Agreement or under the provisions of the Labor Code of the Philippines and such other applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

4.4 Force Majeure. The term "Force Majeure/fortuitous event" shall mean all events which could not be foreseen or although foreseen, were inevitable and beyond the control of the Party/ies, and which materially affect the ability of the Party/ies to comply with any of its/their obligations under this Agreement, and shall include, among others, acts of war or the public enemy (whether declared or not), fire, earthquake, flood, typhoons, public disorders, sabotage, rebellion, revolution, civil commotion, strikes, lockouts, boycotts or other industrial or labor disputes, acts, orders and rulings of Government, whether national or local, or any of its agencies and instrumentality, which may adversely affect the performance of the respective obligations or the exercise of the respective rights of the Party/ies and/or their respective agents/employees, or any other cause or causes, whether similar or dissimilar to the foregoing, which are beyond the reasonable control of the Party/ies.

In cases of Force Majeure/fortuitous events and/or when public interest/welfare so demands, the FIRST and SECOND PARTY shall have the right and authority to suspend the implementation of this Agreement or any portion hereof without incurring any liability therefore to the FIRST PARTY and without being deemed to be in breach of this Agreement, upon giving reasonable notice thereof to the FIRST PARTY. Once the event of Force Majeure or fortuitous event has already ceased, the SECOND PARTY's duly-authorized representative shall immediately notify the FIRST PARTY of said event of Force Majeure, and the Parties shall evaluate whether to continue implementation of the terms of this Memorandum of Agreement.

- 4.5 Authority of Signatories. The signatories hereunder represent and warrant that all necessary corporate and other approvals for the execution of this Agreement by the "Parties", respectively, have been duly obtained.
- 4.6 Non-Assignability. This Memorandum of Agreement shall not be assigned by either Party, in whole or in part, without the other Party's prior written consent. Any assignment in contravention of this provision shall be null and void.
- 4.7 Restrictions on Use and Transfer of STARBOOKS or the DOST Science Digital Library Technology. The DOST-STII is the owner of the design and contents of the DOST Digital Science Library Technology.

The SECOND PARTY SHOULD NOT COPY, MODIFY, DECOMPILE, DISASSEMBLE, REVERSE ENGINEER, MERGE, OR TRANSFER THE DESIGN AND CONTENTS OF THE DOST DIGITAL SCIENCE LIBRARY TECHNOLOGY IN WHOLE OR IN PART. Neither it be distributed to others or transferred electronically from one computer to another over a network or used on any multi-terminal computer system.

STARBOOKS stickers (if any) will be strategically placed on the server of the kiosk for security purposes. In case of server failure or other technical problems, the FIRST PARTY shall be notified and if necessary, present during repair and troubleshooting activities, in cases when server failure or technical problems are beyond SECOND PARTY'S ability to repair and troubleshoot.

IF THE SECOND PARTY TRANSFER POSSESSION OF ANY COPY, MODIFICATION, OR MERGED PORTION OF THE DESIGN AND CONTENTS OF THE KIOSK TO ANOTHER PARTY, OR SERVER STICKERS (if any) WILL BE TAMPERED, THIS AGREEMENT IS AUTOMATICALLY TERMINATED FOLLOWING THE PRINCIPLES OF DUE PROCESS.

- 5.9 Notices. All notices and communications which may be given to either of the Parties hereunder, shall be in writing, addressed and deemed properly given if sent by registered mail with return receipt, postage prepaid to the signatories and addresses specified in the first page of this Agreement, or to such other address/es as maybe designated by the Party/ies in subsequent written notice/s.
- 5.10 Non-waiver. The failure of one Party to insist upon the strict performance of any term, condition and/or covenant hereof shall not be deemed a relinquishment or waiver of any subsequent breach of or non-compliance with the same or any other term, condition and/or covenant hereof. No waiver by any one Party of its rights under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed clearly and in writing and signed by said Party.
- 5.11 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be interpreted, governed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
- 5.12 Amicable Settlement. The Parties agree that in the event any dispute of difference arising out of this Agreement or in the interpretation of any of the provisions hereof, the respective signatories of the "Parties" shall promptly meet to resolve such dispute or difference and the joint decision of such signatories shall be binding upon the Parties hereto.
- 5.13 Entire Agreement and Amendments. This Agreement and any other provisions or terms specifically incorporated herein constitute the entire agreement of the Parties. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by all the Parties. The terms, provisions and covenants of any such amendment/s shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- 5.14 Effectivity. This Agreement shall take effect upon its execution by the Parties.
